"It's a summer of celebration in our historic village, as we mark Lewiston's bicentennial and also the 95th anniversary of Lewiston Garden Club," said Judy Talarico, chair of Lewiston GardenFest. "Lewiston GardenFest features plenty of ideas and inspiration to update your own garden or outdoor space, as well as some fun garden-related activities for guests of all ages."

"By attending the event, you help to support Lewiston's ongoing beautification efforts, as proceeds go back into the soil of the community through plantings and other garden-related projects."

Festivalgoers can also stroll through several public and private gardens throughout the weekend with a free garden walk. The gardens vary in size and style, and are located both within walking distance and a short drive from Center Street. Pick up a map highlighting the featured gardens at one of the hospitality booths during the festival.

For budding gardeners, kids can decorate butterfly rocks or create tissue flowers, both while supplies last.

Representatives from Cornell Cooperative Extension will be available in Hennepin Park to answer gardening questions and provide free soil sample analysis.

On Saturday, the Lewiston Gar-

denFest speaker series features David O'Donnell from Eastern Monarch Butterfly at 11 a.m., and Tim Zimmerman from Medford Nursery at 1 p.m. Master gardener Lyn Chimera will present at 1 p.m. Sunday. All garden talks take place in front of the Frontier House.

For those with green thumbs and not-so-green thumbs alike, adults and children are invited to participate in Lewiston GardenFest's container garden contest. Prepare an arrangement in a traditional container or "think outside the planter." Bring a container entry and a stand for display to

the container garden tent in Hennepin Park by 9 a.m. Saturday.

Throughout the weekend, festivalgoers can vote for their favorite container garden. Prizes will be awarded to those containers that garner the most votes.

"That's what we're all about, as well; and we're hoping that all of our fans and everybody loves the music that we play, and support this event," Hoyle said. "Support all the events and all the sponsors here. ..."

"Lots of fun, here on the water. It's as good as it gets - anywhere in America - right here."

The Platinum-selling Filter rose to fame behind hit singles "Hey Man, Nice Shot" and "Take A Picture."

"Anybody that grew up in the late-'90s, early-2000s, everybody knows 'Hey Man, Nice Shot,'" Gooch said. "They're going to be fun. I think it'll be great having them here. They're excited about it. I spoke with their manager and booking agent, and they're

excited to get out to this part of the world and perform for us. So, that's going to be a great night."

In addition to myriad sponsors supporting the concert series, "Thursdays on the Water" is giving back to one worthy organization.

"This year, if you haven't heard already, we decided to donate a free sponsorship, a \$5,000 value, to a local animal rescue - and we let the community pick it out," Gooch said. "We navigated some local animal rescues, and we are happy to have Diamonds in the Ruff this year, as our annual sponsor."

Gooch was joined by event sponsors, musicians and fundraising recipients. Also on hand was City of North Tonawanda Mayor Austin Tylec, who said, "I'm told that this year is going to be big-

ger and better than any year before. We have numerous bands coming. We have numerous food vendors; organizations that will benefit from this event. And this is one of the largest events we have at our Gratwick Park, so I'm very excited. North Tonawanda is behind Mr. Gooch in his efforts."

"Thursdays on the Water" features an assortment of food and beverage vendors on site. Chairs and blankets are allowed, as are pets on a leash, but outside coolers are not permitted.

Parking is free, but can be upgraded to VIP for \$10. One hundred percent of the proceeds will go to support Boy Scout Troop 824.
