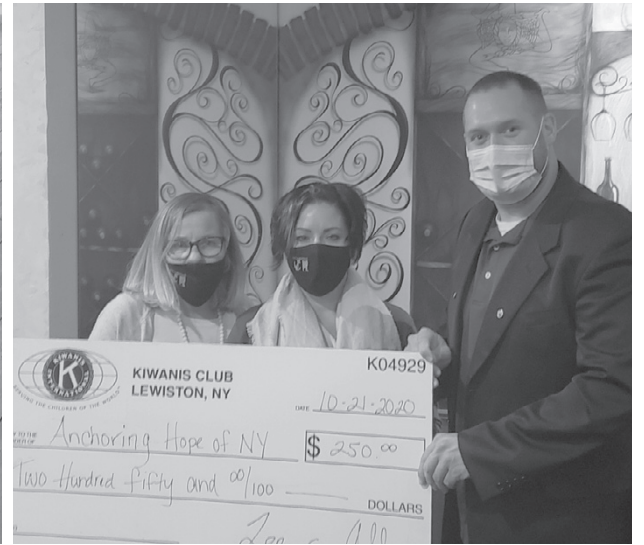


# Catching up with Kiwanis Club
