

Youngstown Lions host dice run bikers



On Saturday, Sept. 18, the Youngstown Lions Club joined with the Western New York Lions Riding Club to present the Bikers Unite for Mercy Flight Dice Run and Car Cruise to benefit Mercy Flight of Western New York.

Organized by Sam Mattina, president of the WNY Lions Riding Club, the event began at the Mercy Flight facility at the Buffalo Niagara International Airport. There, approximately 150 motorcycle riders were escorted by the New York State Police on a two-county route that took the group to Fort Niagara State Park in Youngstown before concluding the ride at American Legion Post No. 1451 in Wheatfield.

At Fort Niagara, the Bikers visited with the Youngstown Lions, where they had time to socialize, roll the dice, eat/drink and take a break. Around 2 p.m., the participants departed Fort Niagara State Park for Wheatfield.

"This truly was a very impressive sight to see that many motorcycles and police escorts arrive in Fort Niagara and head down Main Street heading to Lewiston and final destination at the VFW Post on Ward Road, Wheatfield in Bergholz," Youngstown Lion Ernie Lavigueur said. "In addition to motorcycles, the event included a few classic cars and a dump truck."

He noted the after-party event was a huge success with food trucks, vendors and 182 baskets to raffle off.
