NCCC president signs 3-year contract

Niagara County Community College (NCCC) Board of Trustees Chairman Jason Cafarella announced William J. Murabito signed a three-year contract to continue serving as college president until 2024.

"We are very pleased with the leadership of Dr. Murabito during these challenging times," Cafarella said. "The new contract represents the board's unanimous and unwavering confidence in President Murabito and the trajectory of the college."

Murabito was appointed president of NCCC in December 2019 after serving as interim president since September of 2017. Mu-

rabito has held the role of interim president at SUNY Cobleskill in 2002, Sullivan County Community College in 2011, and SUNY Morrisville in 2013, and as CEO/officer-in-charge at Rockland Community College in 2003. Murabito has also held several positions at SUNY system administration between 1983 and 2002.

"I am pleased to have the opportunity to continue to contribute to NCCC's growth and prosperity as we enter into its 60th anniversary year," Murabito said. "NCCC is a very special place."

The terms of the contract were not disclosed.

NCCC Veterans Memorial Park campaign

Niagara County Community College will be relocating and expanding its existing Veterans Memorial Park to honor the Niagara County veteran community. This park will not only represent those who served in the armed forces, but will also offer community programming to celebrate a proud heritage of military service.

Area veterans, their families, and NCCC alumni and employees are invited to memorialize their service and those of their loved ones on the new monument (alive or deceased). Veteran names and military branch of service will be engraved on the memorial wall, benches and flagpoles for a donation of \$150 or more. Veterans will be honored annually during NCCC's Veteran's Day ceremonies.

The new site will include a pentagonal-shaped concrete pad with a memorial wall separated into three distinct sections, two new flagpoles affixed with the Ameri-

can flag and POW flag, and reflection benches. The picturesque new location will be surrounded by landscaping along with a walkway leading directly to and from the parking lot for easy accessibility.

NCCC Child Development Center receives grant to offer subsidized child care to community

Niagara County Community College was recently announced as a recipient of a funding award under the competitive U.S. Department of Education Child Care

Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS) program. The award was in the amount of \$307,192 over four years. Through this program, both NCCC students and members of the community are eligible to enroll their children at the NCCC John R. Oishei Child Development Center (CDC) at an income-based, subsidized rate.

A press release stated, "NCCC is committed to serving our students and the local community by offering the best child care services possible at the lowest rate. In addition to offering subsidized child care, the CDC was recently able to utilize grant funding to perform a number of upgrades to its facilities including to the outdoor playground."

Christine Duquin, director of the John R. Oishei Child Development Center, said, "I am excited to have both of our playgrounds resurfaced as we add new equipment to the area for the community to enjoy. As always, all of our facility upgrades are done with an eye toward increasing the usage, inclusion and safety for our children."

NCCC said, "With the increased demand for child care services and specifically those from 0-18 months of age, the center is in the process of engaging professional architectural services to review our current space, to determine if expanded services are viable. The NCCC CDC is located in a state-of-the-art facility within the Campus Learning Commons that provides students and members of the community with peace of mind that their child is receiving the best possible care throughout the week. Accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), parents can be assured their young children will participate in a developmentally appropriate early childhood curriculum with experienced, professional teachers and caregivers."
