

# LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Monday, Sept. 27, to Sunday Oct. 3, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD reported 226 response calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook

## Monday, Sept. 27

- **4000 block of Creek Road, suspicious activity** – Caller reported a parked vehicle in the front lot with Florida registration and a male asleep inside. Vehicle listed as a blue Nissan four door sedan; plate number logged. Patrol reported both the vehicle and the rightful owner as valid, out of Florida. Call handled.
- **400 block of Plain Street, alarm burglary** – Security company reported a commercial burglary alarm from the rear side door of the building. Building cleared by patrol.
- **5700 block of Lewiston Road, assist public** – Male caller to 911 reported receiving threatening messages the day earlier via the phone. Patrol said a male co-worker of the complainant sent the messages. Patrol spoke with the caller and advised him to have no contact with the sender; patrol also advised the male in question.
